1. Overview of organizational changes (effective April 1, 2024)

(1) Purpose

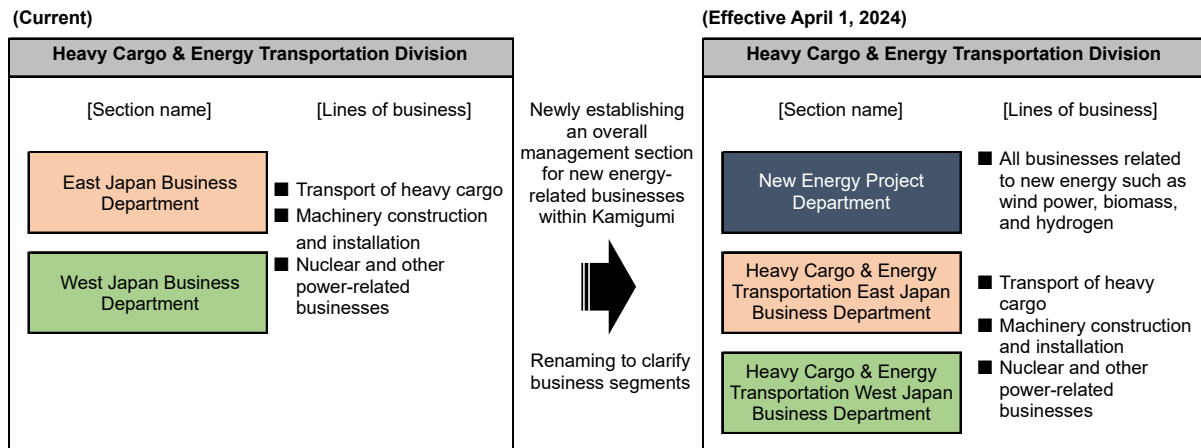
Amid the accelerating global movement to realize a decarbonized society, growing demand for new energy such as wind power and biomass power generation is expected to lead to growth in related markets. As part of efforts in the Exploration of New Businesses, one of the key strategies of its current Medium-Term Management Plan, Kamigumi is currently addressing logistics related to new energy and will newly establish a specialized section capable of cross-functional overall management within the Heavy Cargo & Energy Transportation Division to enhance initiatives in this promising growth field.

In addition to establishing the new section, Kamigumi will rename some current business departments to clarify their business segments within this business department.

(2) Specifics of organizational changes, organizational structure, etc.

The New Energy Project Department will be newly established within the Heavy Cargo & Energy Transportation Division.

The East Japan Business Department and the West Japan Business Department in the Heavy Cargo & Energy Transportation Division will be renamed the Heavy Cargo & Energy Transportation East Japan Business Department and the Heavy Cargo & Energy Transportation West Japan Business Department, respectively.
